Mr. Albert "Al" Henry Hrutkay, Jr., 72, passed away Wednesday, March 11, 2020, at Methodist University Hospital in Memphis, TN. 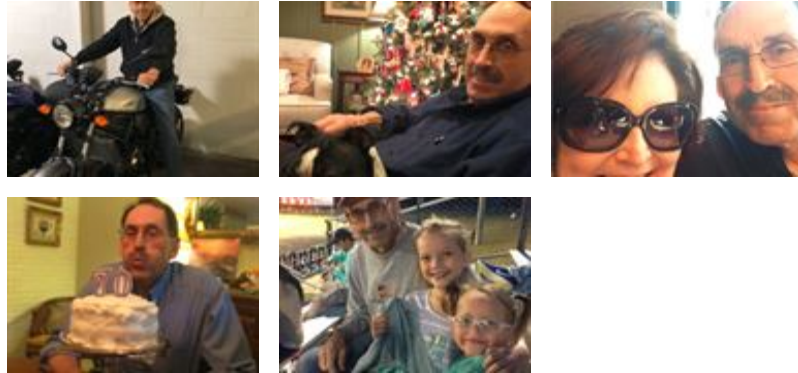
