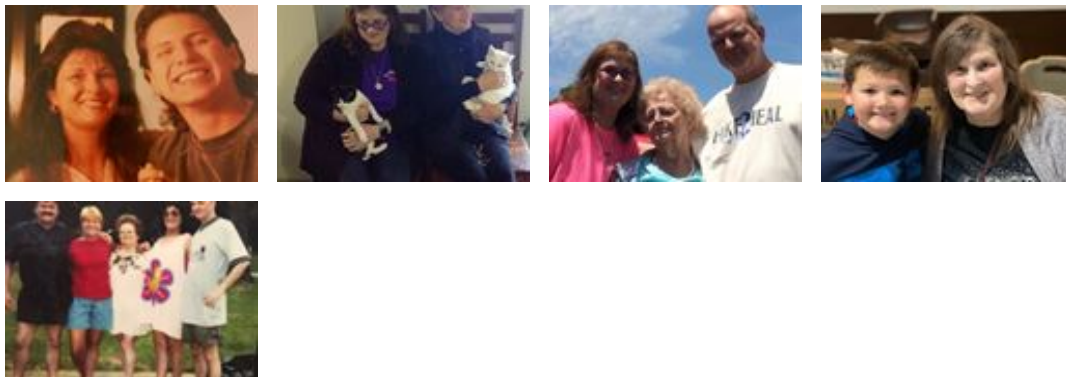

“ It is with great sorrow that I must share that my beloved sister Brenda passed away Thursday September 22nd. Brenda was an incredibly strong woman who survived 9 1/2 years after being diagnosed and treated for pancreatic cancer. She was a "Whipple Warrior" which means she survived the extreme surgery she went through in January of 2013. Surviving that drastic surgery took incredible strength and meant enduring a lot of pain and changes to her life that many would not conquer. But she did! She endured so much so that she would be here for her family. Brenda has always been the heart, the rock, the center of our family. Our Daddy died tragically in an automobile accident when Brenda was a few weeks short of turning 6 years old. At that time I had just turned 3 years old and my brother Michael was only 6 months old. At that tender young age, Brenda took it upon herself to help her grieving mother and to care for her younger siblings. 5 years later our baby brother Jay was born and Brenda now had 3 young ones to take care of. Our Mama was a single working Mom and Brenda was the one who took care of all of us. Throughout all of our lives, Brenda has always been the one who took on the responsibility of caring for all of her siblings, her Mother, her children, her husband, her husband's mother and his siblings, extending to Aunts, Uncles, Nieces, Nephews, Grandchildren, Spouses, Friends and Neighbors.

Brenda acquired her nurses license in the 1970s and to many of us became known as our "Family Doctor." She was so knowledgeable, always available day or night for housecalls or Tele-Med services and we all trusted her judgement.

God richly blessed Brenda with 4 children of her own, and a step-daughter which has brought her a wealth of additional loved ones by way of her children's spouses and 9 grandchildren. By surviving cancer these last 9 1/2 years, though filled with challenges, she enjoyed the special blessing of a very close and loving relationship with her 2 youngest grandsons, now 10 and 14 years of age.

Brenda had spent the last 5 weeks in the hospital. So many of you, my friends and family have been praying for her. During these weeks that Brenda was battling declining health, I felt desperately fearful of how to deal with a future without her. Your prayers have sustained me. When she passed away today (9/22/2022) I initially felt overwhelmed with grief. But God is merciful and allowed me to know and to feel the joy that awaited her. I knew that my beloved sister Brenda has a very close, loving and faithful relationship with Christ Jesus and that she has always felt comfortable knowing she'd spend Eternity in Heaven. I know she had waited 65 years to see our Daddy and 3 years to be reunited with our Mama and I know how she anticipated the reunion with all who passed before her. I know that she is now rejoicing!

Many of us who are grieving over this great loss will be gathering this Saturday, September 24th to celebrate the life of Brenda Faye Darling Booth, the heartbeat of our family. If you can join us, please do. We must hold her close in our hearts and we should hold onto each other with the same pure love that Brenda had for each of us, cause that's what Brenda would want!
