Charles E. Noble, Jr., 80, passed away in Oxford, MS, on Tuesday, December 22, 2020. No services are planned at this time. Coleman Funeral Home of Oxford is in charge of arrangements.

Charlie was born to the late Charles and Grace Noble in North Bergen, NJ. He was married to Susan Noble for 55 years.

After obtaining an Associate's degree, Charlie went on to join the United States Army serving a total of 30 years and reaching the rank of Commander Sergeant Major. He served as a helicopter pilot. He also received a Battlefield Commission in Vietnam and 3 bronze stars for valor. Charlie was a very brave and courageous soldier who loved his country.

After retiring from the military, Charlie opened a Trophy and Engraving Shop. After that venture, he retired again. Charlie is described by his wife as being a great man who was fully devoted to her. Each day after she got home from work, he would go out and open the garage door for her, making sure she got in the house safely.

Charlie never asked anybody to do anything he wouldn't do himself. His

legacy will be left behind in his sons and grandson, who have followed in Dad's footsteps, serving their country. His son, Warren served 29 years and his grandson, WO1 Christian is following Grandad's steps in becoming a helicopter pilot.

Charlie is survived by his wife, Susan Noble, of Oxford, MS; two sons, Scott Joseph (Nancy) Noble, of Salt Lake City, UT, and Warren Douglas (Midge) Noble, of Columbia, TN; two grandsons, WO1 Christian (Hannah King) Noble and Eddey Robinson, of CO; and one granddaughter, Hannah Kathleen Noble, of Salt Lake City.

Charlie was preceded in death by his parents, Charles and Grace Noble; one brother, Robert Noble; and one sister, Shirley Reimer.
