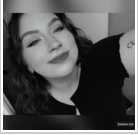

Uncle Dan had passed gas and wanted to make sure we suffered from the smell. It may be an odd memory but looking back on it, I’m thankful I have it.

My last major memory that I have and I hold it so close to my heart is the last time I really spent time with Uncle Dan. Originally I wasn’t going to visit the new house they moved to in Murray because I wasn’t feeling my best, but I decided that it had been too long and I needed to see my family. I surprised the family by bringing my momma to come too. I always knew my uncle Dan as a silly, goofy and carefree man but I got to see a new side of his playfulness. I honestly was a little shocked but in a good way. I realized how similar my mom and him are. I got to watch the two of them act like kids and it filled my heart seeing both of them so happy together.
