Fred "Freddie" Cribbs Ross, 68, died Sunday, November 13, 2016 at Methodist Union Hospital in Memphis, TN.

Born in Tutwiler, MS, Mr. Ross and his wife, Georgeanne, had moved to the Oxford area in 2000 where he was a self-employed realtor. Prior to that time, he had farmed for 22 years.

He received his bachelor's degree from the University of Alabama and served in the Army Reserve. Being possessed of a gregarious nature, he was a member of several coffee clubs and never met a stranger. Mr. Ross enjoyed restoring and tinkering with old farm equipment, grist mills, tractors, fly-wheel engines and hit-and-miss engines. He was a member of St. John's Catholic Church in Oxford.

A funeral service will be held Friday, November 18, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. at Coleman Funeral Home of Oxford with a reception following at the funeral home. Fr. Joe Tonos will officiate. Coleman Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

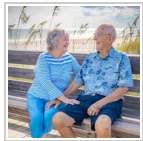

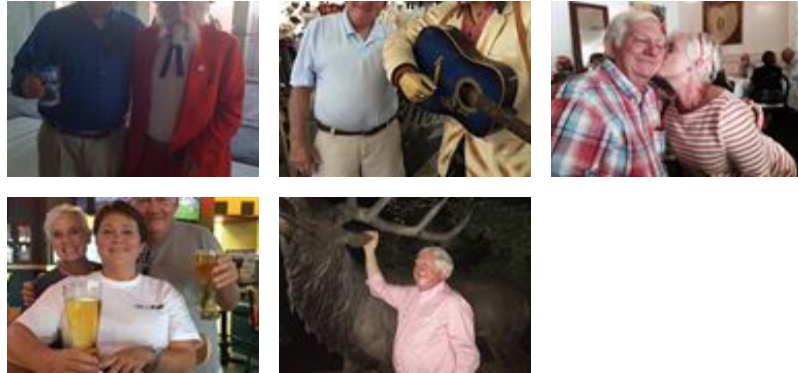
