The friends he made and mainly loved were the ones he'd made through skateboarding; great memories were made, and his friends will remember him most through the stories they share about the times they spent on and off the skateboard. While passionate about skateboarding, Justin rode BMX and inline skates occasionally, making him a well-rounded individual in the extreme sports realm. Justin loved his older sister, Christy, too; they considered themselves ninjas.

Justin loved PB&J's, listening to music, and yelling movie quotes (Mom, the meatloaf!!!). But more than anything, he loved his two sons, Blaine Cole and Nolan Reed Judkins. Blaine and Justin loved going to the park to fish, skateboard, and ride bikes. Once, Justin built a motorized bicycle for Blaine with an extra seat and footpegs to ride together. And with Nolan, they would watch Cocomelon for hours, go to the park, and spend all the quality time together as father and son. Blaine and Nolan were the light of his life and the reason behind his smiles.
