Mr. Kelly M. Weaver, 67, passed away Saturday, July 24, 2021, surrounded by his loving family. A visitation will be held Tuesday, July 27, 2021, from 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Coleman Funeral Home of Southaven (626 Star Landing Rd. East, Southaven, MS 38672). A celebration of life will immediately follow at 2:00 p.m., also at Coleman Funeral Home of Southaven. Rev. Bill Vail will officiate. Coleman Funeral Home of Southaven is in charge of arrangements.

Kelly's journey on this earth started on May 10, 1954. He was born in Memphis, TN to Tommy and Helen Weaver. Kelly was the second oldest of four boys (Keith, Kenny, and Kevin), which made for a wild and entertaining upbringing. Growing up, Kelly loved sports, hunting, and working in his family's business.

On March 2nd, 1978, Kelly's journey was transformed when he met Jesus as his personal Lord and Savior. This changed the trajectory of his life, his purpose on earth, and his eternal residency.

Kelly married his wife of 42 years, Cathy Williams Weaver, in June of 1979. They got busy quickly and had their first child, Blair Weaver Anderson, in 1980. Their son, Blake Weaver was born in 1983, and their youngest son,

Brett Weaver, was born in 1986.

Kelly and Cathy served the Lord in pastoral ministry for 42 years. Their ministry efforts were rooted in Jackson, TN, Denton, TX, Tumbling Shoals, AR, Southaven, MS, Uijongbu, South Korea, Fairbanks, AK, and finally, Southaven, MS.

Kelly never met a stranger, and he was passionate about introducing others to Jesus. He was infamous for shouting "Glory!" whenever he was moved by the Spirit. While that often startled others around him, it was evidence of his zeal for the Lord.

Kelly leaves behind his wife, three children, and seven grandchildren. While they will dearly miss him, they are all so proud of the way he ran his race. Kelly is a faithful warrior who is now in heaven. He is convinced it was worth it.

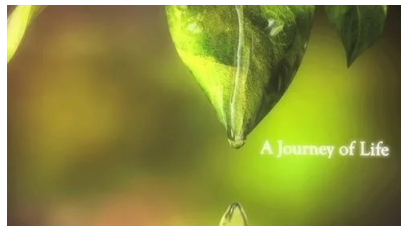

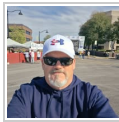

“ When I awoke on July 27, 2021, the Holy Spirit impressed on me, that if, during the celebration of life service, there was an “open-microphone” opportunity, that I would/should speak. And why? It is because I have a message to share about grief and how God brought me through some very dark days following the death of my mother. In fact, July 29, 2021 will mark three years since I experienced what is and probably will always be, the greatest loss which was the loss of my sweet mother. God has shown me to turn my pain into a purpose! When someone has experienced loss, I always want to reach out in hopes that something I do or say, will help ease their pain so and allow them to draw strength. This time was no exception. I wanted to be there and say something very profound, to the Weaver family, the Williams family and countless others for which the life of Kelly Weaver made great impact. My brief message to this audience was going to include how, through Jesus we no longer have to fear the grave, that because of the love of the Master, we can all shout the victory in Heaven, that the greatest challenge of grief is not allowing the grief to crush you, the good memories will see us through the dark days, that there is true peace ONLY in the name of the Lord and that eventually, the tears of sorrow will lessen, the smiles will eventually return and that Kelly’s faith has now become sight. So, during the beautiful service on yesterday, once the open-mic opportunity was announced, I knew this was my chance to share my message. That is to share the message , all of which I learned through the very faith that I set aside, as my child-like trust felt abandoned and my anger toward God, for taking away such a precious gift, had lessened. I wanted to explain that the inward sadness was becoming less and was being replaced by more happiness when I think of my mother! There were several people that raced to the podium to share their incredible stories of Kelly and how he ministered to each of them. The moment came where the open-mic session ended and I was still sitting in my seat with my message trapped inside my mind. I was disappointed because I knew that there was at least one person in the audience that needed to hear my message. Then, my epiphany occurred in that I was the one who needed to hear (and be reminded) of the

message that I thought was meant for others. After all, I have made such progress in the fight against the grief crushing my spirit. All that I have learned about grief is a message that I hope to share with others going through a similar battle. I then started thinking about the people that attended the service, all who know Kelly Weaver in different ways and for different reasons. But, the one common thing for all was that Kelly was a man that God used as an instrument of power. Once Kelly found Christ and began a lifelong service for Him, God used Kelly and although Kelly has left this life, God was still using Kelly, especially to minister to me through the love that was expressed via the podium, and even that which wasn't expressed by me. God is a wondrous and awesome God. Kelly's life and service to our Savior was not in vain but rather, a multitude of people saw Kelly's light and his good works, and through that his light and good works, God was glorified. Through all of the many comments I heard about Kelly, never once did anyone question Kelly's child-like trust and faith but rather, that we all have a peace about where Kelly Weaver will spend eternity. The life of Kelly made impact on many, which will follow for many generations. My hearts and prayers are with Kelly's precious family. It is my hope that all can transition their pain into a purpose, forget about themselves, magnify the Lord and worship Him. I pray that God is and will be in our head and in our thinking, our mouths and in our speaking and our hearts and in our loving. I pray that God will speak to us, through us and in spite of us!
