Leo Anthony Andreoli, II, 47, passed away October 15, 2022, in Memphis, TN after succumbing to his injuries from a hit-and-run accident while riding his motorcycle. A visitation will be held Saturday, October 22, 2022 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at Coleman Funeral Home of Southaven (626 Star Landing Road East, Southaven, MS, 38672). Tony was born May 19, 1975, in Memphis, TN. Tony is remembered as being a "big teddy bear", having a tough outer shell, yet funny and caring on the inside. He lived life to the fullest, was a truck driver, a hard worker, and was an encourager to everyone in his life. He was the founder of Leg Up Gains and served as a personal trainer. He was also an avid biker and created a family within the biker community. He was known to joke and pick fun with his fellow bikers and always kept them laughing. On the weekends, Tony was involved in a variety of charities and would show up for anyone in need. He was a true inspiration to others, especially in difficult times. Most importantly, he deeply loved his family. He was married for 26 years to his wife, Christy, who recently passed away just three weeks ago. Together, they raised their beautiful daughter, Carissa, who he cherished. Although he was known to most as "Tony", he was known by other names: "Tony Five-Toes" which he received after a motorcycle accident, Uncle Edo, Pops, and Punkin Pie. No matter what

name he was known by, he has left behind an impact on everyone's lives and will be deeply missed.

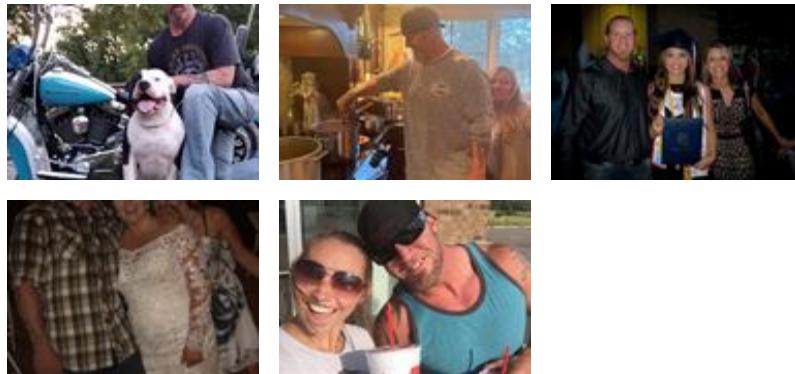
