Dr. Lowell "Schoie" Glenn Evans, Jr., 78, of Sardis, MS, passed away on Sunday, September 29, 2024. 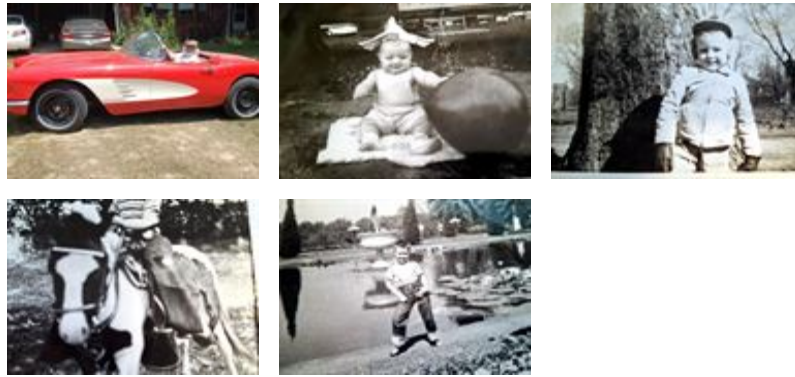

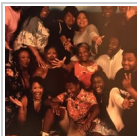
