Dr. Raymond Richard Stasiak, age 84, died Thursday, October 27, 2005, at his residence in Oxford, MS.

Dr. Stasiak retired from the United States Air Force and taught for ten years as a professor of chemical engineering at the University of Mississippi. He had received his B.S. in chemical engineering at the University of Mississippi, his M.S. and M.B.A. from the University of Dayton, and his Ph.D. in Education from the University of Mississippi. He was a member of the Rotary Club, Woods Order, past president of the Lions Club, and past commander of the VFW. He was also a member of Phi Delta Kappa, the American Institute of Chemical Engineers and the American Chemical Society. Dr. Stasiak was a disabled World War II veteran who held two patents with the U.S. Air Force and was awarded the Meritorious Civilian Award. He retired as director of research and development at Wright-Patterson AFB.
