Sharon is preceded in death by her parents, Alice Ruth McGraw and Holland Lee McGraw.

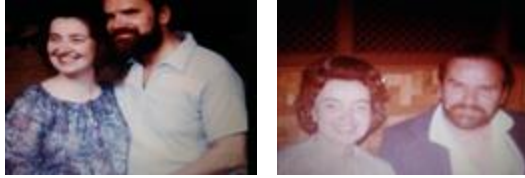



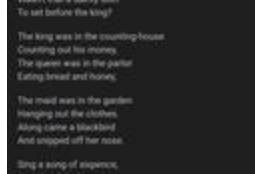
