



## Dr. Suresh Bandari

Dr. Suresh Bandari, 43, of Oxford, Mississippi, passed from this life on Monday, September 5, 2022, at Baptist Memorial Hospital East in Memphis, Tennessee. The family will receive friends on Saturday, September 10, 2022, from 10:00 AM until 12:00 PM at Coleman Funeral Home of Oxford. The service celebrating his life will take place at 12:00 PM in the chapel of Coleman Funeral Home.

Suresh was Born on September 23, 1978, in the village of Bheemaram in Telangana, India, to his parents, Mogiliah Bandari and Kousalya Bandari. He had made numerous reliable friends over his childhood and college years who were there for him when he needed them. Suresh provided for his family by serving as a dedicated Research Assistant Professor of Pharmaceutics and Drug Delivery at the University of Mississippi. He was dedicated not only to the tedious research projects but also to the students he served. Suresh was notorious for being a selfless and kind man, an immaculate planner, and lending a helping hand to his students. His help often went beyond the laboratory as he guided young men and women along the path of opportunities found in the United States. He directed numerous of his students to achieve their American Dream. Aside from his benevolent spirit and knowledge of medications, he had his hands in numerous organizations within the field of pharmaceutical sciences. He had a passion for the continual growth and advancement in the field to which he dedicated his life.
