William (Bill) Fletcher Hall, 101, of Olive Branch, MS passed away on Tuesday, July 5, 2022. 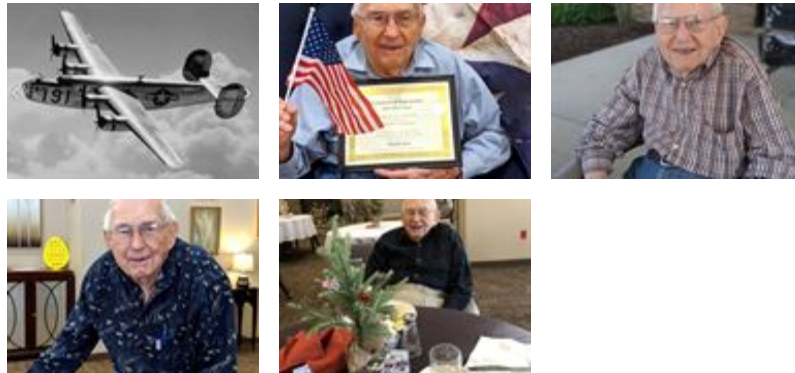
